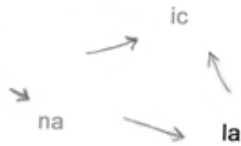

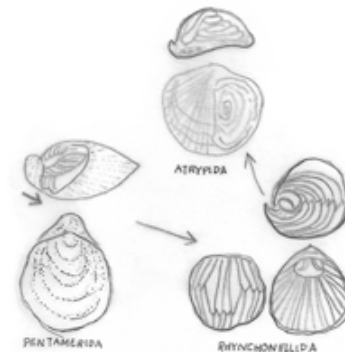

**syl·la·cru·sta·cean** (sīl-ə-kru-stā-shən)

- 1 a tiny shelled creature that feeds off the forgotten utterances that fall to the bottom of the sea
- 2 any sea creature as small in size as a single syllable
- 3 the inaudible form of communication shared by articulates



**van·do·dac·u·lar** (văn-dō-dăk'-yə-lə r) the undulating function of the five bones of the sacrum [now fused] that allowed our homosapien ancestors to flick<sup>1</sup> their tails.<sup>2</sup>

<sup>1</sup>the movement allowed them to cast off their tails, helping them elude predators. predators became either distracted by the wriggling of the detached tail or were left with only the tail in their mouths while the rest of the body fled. [tails cast off in this manner generally grow back over time, unless evolution occurs.]

<sup>2</sup> the coccyx, or tailbone, is the remnant of a lost tail.
